	The Black Sea's unique coastal and marine resources are of great natural value and bear substantial socio-economic benefit, but also offer opportunities for the sustainable growth of the industries that depend on them. The post-pandemic recovery of the economy, the ambitious targets of the European Green Deal and the new EU multiannual financial framework (2021–27) pose both challenges for the blue economy sectors and opportunities for the Bulgarian authorities in their efforts to restore growth and jobs. The economic value of Bulgaria's blue economy is significant and can provide a sizable contribution to the country's post-pandemic economic recovery.
